F3 Options 2021

Doing an F3 (time out of training between F2 and ST1/CT1) has become increasing popular in recent years. This is for a number of reasons:

- Some people are unsure of what specialty they wish to apply to so want to spend time exploring options.
- Others already know which specialty but wish to spend time strengthening their application.
- Some people want to explore medicine abroad, return to academia or even take a break from medicine entirely.

If you do wish to undertake an F3 start your planning early- especially if you want to go overseas! Because of the uncertainty surrounding COVID make sure you have a back up plan.

However, F3s aren't for everyone. Please be aware that more and more specialties are offering part-time training as well as deferred entry. A number of training programmes will be supportive of trainees applying for OOPE (out of programme experience) or undertaking additional roles (such as an NHS leadership fellowship or clinical teaching fellowship). This may offer you the benefits of being in a training programme with the flexibility & opportunities of an F3.

Top Tips

- Speak to your colleagues (core trainees and registrars) for advice (many of them will have undertaken F3s)
- Speak to your consultants if you wish to remain in a certain specialty- it is advantageous for them to hire F3s into a fixed trust grade post rather than rely on locums.
- Don't forget about appraisal/GMC designated body and indemnity.
- Think about sitting membership exams/professional diplomas (MRCP, MRCS, DRCOG etc)
 which might give you points on core training applications- look at the person specification
 for your speciality.

F3 Options 2021 compiled by Dr Peter Tamony who undertook an F3 (and F4!) which involved locum bank work (ED & paediatrics), course/exams (DTM&H, DOccMed, PgCert Medical Education), and a teaching job (clinical lecturer at St George's). Peter applied for GP training with deferred entry and completed his ST1 less than full time (60%) so he could combine this with lecturing.

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
