Children's Community Nursing Team

Where are we?

The Children's Community Nursing Team are based on Kipling Ward at Conquest Hospital in St Leonards-on-sea and The Paediatric Hub at Eastbourne District General Hospital

Who are we?

We are a team of specialist nurses who provide skilled nursing care and support to babies, children and young people and their families in the familiar environment of their own home.

Aims of the service

To reduce hospital admissions for children and allow earlier discharge from hospital.

To work in partnership with children and families to provide a flexible and individual service providing nursing support at home for each baby, child and young person who we visit.

Role of the team

- Providing teaching and practical supervision for parents and carers.
- Nursing care for children with short term and acute conditions such as wound care and administration of intravenous antibiotics.
- Nursing care for children with chronic conditions such as juvenile arthritis.
- Providing advice and support to children, at home with complex health needs including assessments for continuing health care provision.
- Specialist nurse support is provided for children with cancer and cystic fibrosis, including the management of central lines and administration of chemotherapy.
- Nursing care for children with a tracheostomy and home ventilation.
- Nurse led clinics for children with eczema (Kipling only).
- Blood tests for children who require this procedure on a regular basis or who would benefit from having this test carried out at home.
- Care of children requiring home oxygen.
- Care of children with nasogastric, jejunal and gastrostomy tubes.
- Supporting and caring for children with life limiting and life-threatening conditions including those requiring end of life care. We often work together with the Demelza Nursing Team and Chestnut Tree House to ensure nurses are available whenever needed.
- We are able to organise admission to hospital when necessary for children who have complex care needs and are normally cared for at home.
- We work closely with local G.P's, health visitors, and school nurses.
- We communicate with the nursing and medical teams from specialist hospitals.

Team Contact Details

After referral to the service from your Consultant Paediatrician or ward staff, one of the community nurses will make contact with you and arrange a home visit. If your child is in hospital one of the nursing staff will meet you on the ward.

Equipment

We have a supply of equipment which we lend to families to support the care of their child at home. This will require yearly maintenance which the nursing team will organise.

Supplies

We will order supplies for your child ready for when they are discharged home from hospital.

If your child's care is provided by the team from Kipling Ward, then the supplies will be delivered to Kipling for you to collect from there.

If your child's care is provided by the team from Friston ward, then the supplies will be delivered to the Scott Unit if you live in the Eastbourne area, or Newhaven rehab centre, Uckfield Hospital, Orchard house in Lewes or Grove House at Crowborough hospital.

When you require further supplies, please ring the office numbers and leave us a message. It usually takes two weeks from ordering for the supplies to arrive.

Role in education

We visit schools, nurseries and respite centres and can provide nursing care in these settings. We also teach staff how to carry out some procedures for children that are required on a regular basis while away from home.

Students

We will sometimes have a student nurse working with us for a few weeks placement to learn about care of children in their home environment.
