How can we help you?

My name is **Julie Smithson** and I am a Macmillan Dermatology Clinical Nurse Specialist for skin cancer.

There are several different types of skin cancer. Often the more common types of skin cancers are less serious and the surgery you have already had to diagnose your skin cancer, may also have treated it at the same time and so management for this is complete. You may have received a letter confirming your result or someone from the team may not have been present when your result was discussed with you

Sometimes the diagnosis of skin cancer is more serious.

Whatever the result has been, you may have questions or concerns. A major part of my role is to be your key worker, offering support, information and guidance for patients with a diagnosis of skin cancer. I can also provide support for your family.

My name is **Ami Thunder** and I am a Dermatology Cancer Support Worker. I am here to provide additional support alongside your medical team and your Clinical Nurse Specialist. I will be your point of contact through your cancer journey and am here to help you with any concerns you may have.

Who else is in our support team?

We form part of a team of health care professionals, specialising in different aspects of care. This includes topical management (creams applied to treat the skin cancer), surgery, radiotherapy, systemic anticancer therapy (management with drugs) and supportive care. We work closely together to provide patients with the best possible treatment.
