Post Procedure Advice following a Transnasal Endoscopy

What to do/ expect after the procedure if you had sedation

Following your examination today you are advised to go home and rest.

If your procedure was carried out with a conscious sedative injection, it is important for the next 24 hours **you do not:**

Drive a car/motorbike or ride a bicycle Operate any domestic appliances or machinery Look after young children alone Sign any legal documents Drink alcohol Take sleeping tablets

One of the effects of sedation is that you may not remember having the procedure, this is normal.

A responsible adult should stay with you for 12 hours following your procedure if you have been given sedation.

What to do/ expect after the procedure

You will need a good few burps to bring up the air.

You should not blow your nose hard for 2-4 hours to help prevent any bleeding. It is ok to wipe your nose with a tissue/handkerchief.

As the procedure involves passing an endoscope through the gullet, you may experience sore throat for about 24-48 hours. This can usually be relieved with cold drinks or ice to suck.

Eating and Drinking

You will have been offered a drink following transnasal endoscopy prior to your discharge home.

After this time, you can resume your normal diet as you feel able.

Medication

All medication is to be taken as normal after the procedure, unless otherwise directed. Pain relieving tablets, such as the type you would take for a headache, may be taken at home as per the manufacturer's instructions.

Work

If you have not had sedation, you may continue as normal.

When to seek help/advice

Serious side effects are rare however if any of the following occur within 48 hours after your procedure consult a doctor immediately:

Chest pains Difficulty breathing Fever Severe abdominal pain Severe bloating

If you should notice signs of excessive bleeding such as: Excessive nose bleeding Coughing up large amounts of blood Vomiting blood

A small amount of bleeding can occur following biopsies and should not be a cause for concern.
