I am responding to your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act. The answers to your specific questions are as follows:

I am requesting information on your Trust's usage of ambulatory electrocardiogram (EKG or ECG) Holter monitors and associated software for analysis reporting.

1) Does the Trust use ambulatory electrocardiogram (EKG or ECG) Holter monitors?

Yes.

(i) If "Yes" then which make and models are currently in use and how many of each are currently deployed?

Novacor - R.Test Evolution 4, 109 are currently deployed.

(ii) If "No" then does the Trust intend to implement ambulatory electrocardiogram (EKG or ECG) Holter monitoring in the near future?

Not applicable.
