

Research section



The Research Department have provided details of a clinical research study being supported by the Trust:

The Trust was selected to support a clinical research study designed by the Asthma team at Queen Alexandra Hospital, Portsmouth in collaboration with colleagues across the Wessex Asthma Network. <u>REDUCE CARBON</u> (Principal Investigator – Dr James Wilkinson, Consultant Respiratory Physician and Deputy Chief Medical Officer) is a randomised control trial looking to understand whether the prescribing choice for inhalers is influenced by knowledge of the carbon footprint.

In the UK, over 50 million inhalers are prescribed each year with more than 70% of these containing propellants that are powerful greenhouse gases contributing to global warming. Inhalers account for about 3% of the carbon footprint of the NHS each year!

There is an urgent need to address this and by taking part in the study you can help us to explore how inhaler choices are made and whether carbon footprint information changes prescribing recommendations.

It is a short online questionnaire that should take <u>no more than 5 minutes to complete</u>. We know both prescribing and non-prescribing healthcare professionals have a major influence on inhaler choice and would encourage as many health-care professionals as possible to take part.

You DO NOT need to be a prescriber or even have Respiratory patients on your caseload to take part in this study and is suitable for both registered and unregistered staff.
