FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT

I am responding to your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act. The answers to your specific questions are as follows:

Q1. In the last 6 months, how many patients have been diagnosed with Diffuse Large B Cell Lymphoma (DLBCL)? 15

a. Of these patients, how many commenced treatment at your trust within the last 6 months? 15

Q2. In the last 6 months, how many patients have you treated for Diffuse Large B Cell Lymphoma (DLBCL) with the following treatments:

- R-CHOP (rituximab, cyclophosphamide, doxorubicin hydrochloride, vincristine and prednisolone) 4
- R-mini-CHOP (rituximab, cyclophosphamide, doxorubicin hydrochloride, vincristine and prednisolone) 0
- Pola-BR (polatuzumab vedotin with rituximab and bendamustine) 0
- Pola-R-CHP (Polatuzumab vedotin with rituximab, cyclophosphamide, doxorubicin hydrochloride, and prednisolone) 11
- R-CODOX-M (rituximab, cyclophosphamide, vincristine, doxorubicin and methotrexate) 1
- R-IVAC (rituximab, ifosfamide, etoposide and cytarabine) 0
- Axicabtagene ciloleucel 0

Section 17 – Notice of refusal

East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust does not centrally record the referral data as requested in Q4. To enable the Trust to provide this information would require a manual review of all individual haematology letter which we estimate would take much more than the 18 hr appropriate limit. We are therefore applying Section 12(1) to this part of your request.

Section 12(1) of the Act allows a public authority to refuse to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of compliance would exceed the 'appropriate limit', as defined by the Freedom of Information and Data Protection (Appropriate Limit and Fees) Regulations 2004 (the Regulations). These state that this cost limit is £450 for public authorities which are not part of central government or the armed forces. The costs are calculated at £25 per hour per person regardless of the rate of pay, which means that the limit will be exceeded if the work involved would exceed 18 hours. The Trust estimates that the cost of complying with this request would significantly exceed the above limit.

Q5. Do you participate in any active clinical trials for Diffuse Large B-Cell Lymphoma (DLBCL)? If so, can you please provide the name of each trial along with the number of patients taking part or enrolling?

There are no trials currently open or recruiting to Diffuse Large B-Cell Lymphomas.
