What to expect after your Gastroscopy (OGD)

What happens next?

After your OGD, your endoscopist will explain the findings with you. If required, a member of the Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS) team will also attend. Biopsies taken from your procedure will be sent on to the lab for further testing: this can take up to 7-10 working days. You may need further investigations in order to help further with your diagnosis, such as a CT scan of your chest, abdomen and pelvis, along with a PET scan.

What is a CT scan and why do I need this investigation?

A CT scan (Computed Tomography) is a medical imaging technique used to obtain detailed images of the body. The whole appointment can take up to an hour and half depending on which part of your body they are scanning. You might have a CT scan:

- to diagnose a range of conditions including cancer
- to help work out where the possible cancer is, how close to nearby organs and big it is- this can help doctors decide about whether you need further tests or what treatment you need

What is a PET scan and why do I need this investigation?

A Positron Emission Tomography (PET) CT scan combines a CT scan and a PET scan. The scan takes a series of x-rays from all around your body and puts them together to create a 3 dimensional (3D) picture. The PET scan uses a mildly radioactive drug to show up areas of your body where cells are more active than normal. It usually takes between 30 and 60 minutes. PET scans help to:

- diagnose a cancer
- determine how big a cancer is and if it has spread (stage a cancer)
- decide on best treatment for your possible cancer

What is a Multi-Disciplinary Meeting?

A Multi-Disciplinary Meeting (MDM) is formed of a team of different healthcare professionals who work together to provide coordinated care for patients. An MDM is an opportunity to review your investigations and decide on the best possible treatment plan moving forward and any further investigations that may be beneficial to help with your diagnosis and treatment.

Who can support with nutritional needs?
