# **Clinical Nurse Specialists (CNS)**

We are registered nurses who work alongside a multi-professional gastroenterology team

We play a key role in supporting your care and will be the central point of contact between you and your treating MDT (Multi disciplinary team) We offer advice and give psychological support to you and those close to you throughout your illness. Your CNS will be present at most of your consultant appointments, but are on hand for advice and support via phone or email when you need it

As our role involves visiting patients on the wards and attending clinics, there will be occasions when the team are not available at the time of your call. We do have a voicemail service, so please do leave us a message with your *name*, *x number* (*hospital trust number*) *and your contact number*, and we will return your call as soon as we can, which may not be until the next working day. Messages will be prioritised according to clinical need.

# **Specialist Dietitians**

Whilst under the care of the Oesophago-Gastric (OG) team, you will also be supported by a team of specialist dietitians. Their guidance will be tailored to your individual needs, depending on the stage of disease and its effects.

They will keep in regular contact as and when it is needed via a face to face appointment or by telephone.

The dietitians will be able to support you with the following:

- Altered textured diets (e.g. soft and/or liquid diets) associated with any swallowing difficulties related to your diagnosis
- Unintentional weight loss
- Nutritional supplement drinks
- Tube feeding
- Chemotherapy/radiotherapy side effects that affect eating and drinking
- Ongoing support with dietary changes following your operation
- · Disruptions to usual bowel habits
- Vitamin and mineral monitoring

While you are undergoing investigations, during any oncology treatment you have locally or if you are not having any treatment, you will receive care from the **East Sussex Macmillan Dietitians**

### **ONCOLOGISTS**

Depending on your diagnosis and treatment pathway, you may be seen by an Oncologist before and/ or after surgery, or as stand alone treatments. On occasion, you may be seen by a different specialist in the team.

Both clinical oncologists and medical oncologists deliver non-surgical cancer treatment, clinical oncologists primarily deliver radiotherapy. Medical Oncologists deliver systemic anti-cancer treatment such as chemotherapy

# **The Multi-disciplinary Meeting**

We would like to introduce you to the multi-disciplinary team (MDT or MDM) for Upper Gastro Intestinal cancer, at East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust

You will be cared for by a Multidisciplinary team consisting of doctors and nurses who all have specialist training and experience in the diagnosis, care and treatment of patients with UGI cancers. We have listed some of the people in the team caring for you:

- Specialist Gastrointestinal (GI) Cancer Surgeons
- Specialist Oncologists
- Gastroenterologists, trained in the medical management of diseases affecting the oesophagus and stomach
- Macmillan Clinical Nurse Specialists (Key Workers)
- Radiologists, who will have special expertise interpreting scans in relation to Upper gastro Intestinal cancers
- Palliative Care team, who offer advice and support for patients requiring palliative input i.e. pain management
- Patient Pathway coordinator, who ensures the patients care pathway, is smooth and timely
- Dietitian, who provide expert knowledge for patients with swallowing issues related to their cancer.

The MDT works closely together to plan and deliver the most effective treatment and care for each individual patient. This is done in consultation with you and your family, and occurs at each stage of the treatment pathway. The MDT meet on a weekly basis: Friday 08.45–10.00, to discuss individual patients' treatment and care.
