4. Please provide a breakdown of the primary causes for amputation surgeries at your NHS trust since 2017.

East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust (ESHT) does not centrally record the causes for amputation surgery. However, we can confirm that procedures will be performed on adults where there are predisposing medical conditions, e.g. diabetes or for trauma.

Vascular cases requiring amputation will normally be referred to University Hospitals Sussex NHS Foundation Trust.
