## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT

I am responding to your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act. The answers to your specific questions are as follows:

I'm writing to request the number of Duty of Candour breaches recorded by East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust during the 2024/25 financial year. I understand that due to Section 12 (time/cost implications), the full level of detail originally requested may not be available, so I'm happy to narrow the scope to just the number of breaches.

There are no nationally published targets for when a Duty of Candour must be completed by; Care Quality Commission (CQC) Regulation 20 states at point (2) that a duty of candour must be made "...as soon as reasonably practicable...". This means there will be no datasets to measure compliance, and thus no figures pertaining to a breach would be recorded

However, as a responsible healthcare provider we have set our own target for completion of verbal and written Duty of Candour's, and track compliance over a rolling 12-month period for internal quality and assurance standards. As of 8 October 2025, compliance with our target for completing verbal Duty of Candour's was 77%, and 79% for written Duty of Candour's.

As defined by the Care Quality Commission (CQC), the Duty of Candour is a legal requirement for all regulated health and social care providers to be open and transparent with service users and their families when a "notifiable safety incident" occurs. From what I understand, NHS Trusts are required to keep secure written records of these interactions.

The Trust is acutely aware of its duty to adhere to the standards set out at CQC Regulation 20 and maintains records of all communications in respect of Duty of Candour when a notifiable safety incident occurs.
