FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT

I am responding to your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act. The answers to your specific questions are as follows:

Q1. Please provide the total number of patients treated in the last 6 months for:

- Polycythaemia Vera (ICD10 code D45)**

Q2. How many patients were treated in the past 6 months (for any disease) with:

- **Ruxolitinib** 26
- **Fedratinib** 0
- **Momelotinib** 11

Q3. How many patients were treated with Ruxolitinib in the past 6 months for the following diseases?

- **Myelofibrosis (ICD10 code D47.4)** 7
- **Polycythaemia Vera (ICD10 code D45)** 0
- **Other/Unknown** 19

Q4. How many myelofibrosis (ICD10 code D47.4) patients has your trust diagnosed in the past 3 years?

The time period for the figures provided for Q4 (above) is January 2022 – October 2025.

- **Of these patients, how many were treated in the past 6 months with Hydroxycarbamide?** 1
- **Of these patients, how many were treated in the past 6 months with Interferon therapy?** 1
- **Of these patients, how many have received no active treatment in the past 6 months?**

East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust does not centrally record this information. To enable the Trust to provide this information would require a manual review of all relevant patient records which we estimate would take over 18 hours. This is because each record would have to be completely reviewed to be able to confirm that no added treatment was given at any point during the past 6 months, and we estimate that this would take approximately 40 minutes per record. We are therefore applying Section 12(1) to this part of your request.

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Section 12(1) of the Act allows a public authority to refuse to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of compliance would exceed the 'appropriate limit', as defined by the Freedom of Information and Data Protection (Appropriate Limit and Fees) Regulations 2004 (the Regulations). These state that this cost limit is £450 for public authorities which are not part of central government or the armed forces. The costs are calculated at £25 per hour per person regardless of the rate of pay, which means that the limit will be exceeded if the work involved would exceed 18 hours. The Trust estimates that the cost of complying with this request would significantly exceed the above limit.
