FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT

I am responding to your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act. The answers to your specific questions are as follows:

I am emailing you to make a freedom of information request with regard to trauma protocols for silver trauma patients.

We would like to know the following information if available:

1. Does your hospital have a guideline for silver trauma patients (>65 years old) attending ED?

No, East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust (ESHT) does not have a specific guideline for silver trauma patients (>65 years old) attending the Emergency Department (ED).

2. What are the ED's indications for initiating a silver trauma call and requesting a trauma CT for elderly patients at your hospital?

The same criteria used for adult patients is used for elderly patients when the Emergency Departments initiate a silver trauma call and request a trauma CT scan, as shown in the attached ESHT's 'Trauma Call Criteria'.

3. Which specialties are called for silver trauma in ED? Does it include General surgery, Orthopaedics, Anaesthetics and Medicine of the elderly?

Adult trauma call activates Emergency Department Consultants/Middle Grade, Anaesthetics, General Surgery, Orthopaedics, Radiographer.

4. Does your hospital have a guideline for assessing delirium in silver trauma patients (>65 years old)?

Delirium screening is part of the Integrated Patient Documentation.

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5. **Do all the silver trauma patients get reviewed by medicine of the elderly on the ward if admitted?**

No.

6. **Do you have a guideline for assessment of the silver trauma patients on the ward by medicine of the elderly?**

ESHT do not follow any specific guidelines for silver trauma patients.

7. **Can you please attach your hospital's guidelines for silver trauma patients in your reply?**

ESHT do not follow any specific guidelines for silver trauma patients.

Mechanism of Injury and High Energy impact

Step 1

Falls > 3m (one storey)
Fall down full flight of steps .
Ejection from vehicle
Unrestrained occupant of vehicle or inappropriately restrained child
Thrown from horse
Death of another occupant of same vehicle
Car/van/vehicle vs Pedestrian/cyclist :Thrown, run over, or with impact
> 20mph
Motorcycle crash > 20mph
Rollover RTC

Anatomy of Injury

All penetrating injuries to head, neck and torso
Significant external haemorrhage
Significant Chest Injury: eg pneumothorax,haemothorax,flail chest
Femoral shaft # or long bone fracture in more than one limb
Amputation – proximal to wrists or ankles
Pelvic fractures (based on clinical assessment)
Open or depressed skull fractures
Paralysis
Burns >10% in children or >15% in adults
