**1. How many Surgical Robot Systems do you currently own?**

**7. What was the total spend for your trust on robotic consumables in 2024?**

Whilst the Trust holds the information requested, it is applying a Section 43(2) exemption in relation to this part of the request as the release of the information is likely to prejudice its commercial interests.

In applying the exemption consideration has been given to the public interest in enabling scrutiny of public sector decision making and the general public interest in accountability and transparency.

We have concluded that sharing commercials could disadvantage the supplier against their competitors and may leave the Trust open to a legal challenge.

In this instance, we consider that the public interest in withholding the information is greater than the public interest in disclosing the information.

**8. What was the total maintenance and service contract spend per surgical robot in 2024?**

Section 43 applied, please see response to Q7 above.

**9. Does the trust generate any additional revenue through proctorships or training of surgeons on robotic surgery? If so, how much revenue was generated in 2024?**

Nil, no additional revenue is generated.

**10. Does the trust currently have dedicated robotic theatres? If so, how many do you have and roughly when were they established?**

Eastbourne District General Hospital does not have a dedicated theatre, but they do use a specific theatre for robotic activity and have been doing so since February 2016.

The Conquest Hospital, Robotic surgery was introduced in May 2024, and they have one robotic dedicated theatre.
