

Independent auditor's report to the directors of East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust

Audit completion

In our auditor's report, issued on 26 June 2025, for East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust (the 'Trust') for the year ended 31 March 2025, we reported an unqualified opinion on the Trust's financial statements.

We explained that we could not formally conclude the audit and issue an audit certificate for the Trust for the year ended 31 March 2025, in accordance with the requirements of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014 and the Code of Audit Practice, until we had received confirmation from the National Audit Office (NAO) that the audit of the NHS group consolidation is complete for the year ended 31 March 2025. The NAO has confirmed the audit of the NHS group consolidation is complete for the year ended 31 March 2025.

We are therefore satisfied all audit work necessary has been completed.

Report on other legal and regulatory requirements - the Trust's arrangements for securing economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources

Under the Code of Audit Practice, we are required to report to you if, in our opinion, we have not been able to satisfy ourselves that the Trust has made proper arrangements for securing economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources for the year ended 31 March 2025.

In our auditor's report for the year ended 31 March 2025 issued on 26 June 2025 we reported that we have nothing to report in respect of whether the Trust has made proper arrangements for securing economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources for the year ended 31 March 2025, except on 20 June 2025 we identified a significant weakness in how the Trust plans and manages its resources to ensure it can continue to deliver its services. The Trust does not have plans in place to return to a sustainable financial position and has not achieved its 2024-25 financial plan, therefore increasing the risk of failing to deliver the financial plan for 2025-26.

We recommended that the Trust should develop a financial strategy supported by a medium term financial plan that sets out how the Trust will get back to sustainable financial position over the next three years.

No matters have come to our attention since that date that would have resulted in any additional exception reporting on the Trust's arrangements for securing economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources for the year ended 31 March 2025.

Report on other legal and regulatory requirements – audit certificate

We certify that we have completed the audit of East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust for the year ended 31 March 2025 in accordance with the requirements of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014 and the Code of Audit Practice.
